

## Crossfire 2:0

**Students are in groups and the goal is for the entire group to be seated. They do not need to move their desks, just keep the class as is. We then follow the regular crossfire procedure: everyone stands up and the ALT asks a question. Set the timer to 10/20 seconds. The group then peer check an answer between them. When the time is up, students can volunteer to answer. The JTE then chooses one student. The student answers then rolls the dice. Depending on what they roll, select students sit down. The first group to have everyone sitting down wins...until someone rolls a one and everyone has to stand up again!**

| <b>4 – girls:</b>       | <b>all the girls sit down</b>                            |
| <b>5 – boys:</b>        | <b>all the boys sit down</b>                             |
| <b>6 - diagonal:</b>    | <b>diagonal line sits down</b>                           |

**3 – line (side)**

**6 – girls**

**4 – boys**

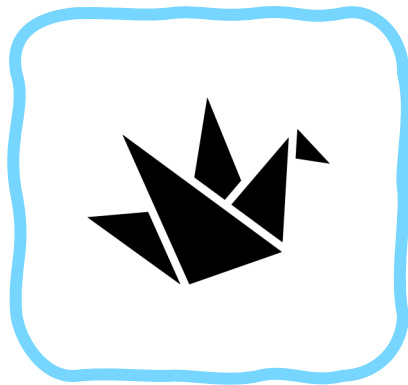
